For more than 60 years, Cardinal McCloskey Services has been entrusted with meeting the ever changing needs of our children, families and adults. The past two years were no different—even with economic uncertainty, Cardinal McCloskey continued to provide for our clients through innovative programs and exceptional service delivery by dedicated staff—much of which is made possible through the generosity of you, our donors. Each year, we:

- Protect over 2,000 children in our Foster Care and Preventive Programs
- Find permanent homes for nearly 50 children through adoption
- Assist over 180 adults with developmental disabilities as they build productive lives as integral members of the community
- Provide over 75,000 meals through our Food Pantries in the Bronx and East Harlem
- Provide educational guidance to over 50 middle school age children, helping them to improve their grades
- Provide exceptional preschool education to over 1,400 three and four year-olds

We also experienced some exciting changes to our agency. We received a generous \$1 million grant from The Thomas and Agnes Carvel Foundation to support our Little Angels Head Start program. Our Bridges to Health program (B2H) was implemented and is moving so quickly that we expect to provide additional medical, mental health and respite services to more than 100 children. In addition, the Heckscher Foundation awarded us a grant to develop the Strategies for Success program allowing us to better meet the educational needs of our children. Our Board Members also revisited the Agency's Mission, Vision, and Values statements hoping to more accurately reflect Cardinal McCloskey's array of service provision and corporate culture and completed a visionary three year Strategic Plan.

Despite our accomplishments, we have not been immune from the current economic challenges, making your support more important than any other time in recent history. I am confident, however, that we will be able to continue to protect, empower, and promote independence for our clients and respond to their ever changing needs with you as our partner. ## **Foster Boarding Home Program**

For over 40 years, our Foster Boarding Home Program has been providing temporary homes with trained and certified foster parents for children, ages newborn to 20 years, whose families are unable to care for them. These children have been mistreated and many have suffered from some level of neglect, emotional, physical or sexual abuse, and are now being removed from their home and placed in an unfamiliar environment. The goal of our devoted staff is to help each child overcome their emotional deprivation or abuse by meeting each child's unique needs for counseling, medical care, mental health services and educational assistance. Our foster parents provide them with a safe environment and give them love and guidance to help achieve their optimum level of growth and development. Every child who comes to us should be secure in the fact that their safety and development is our primary goal and we will do everything within our power to safely reunite them with their family. While the children remain in secure temporary homes, we provide their birth families with parenting skills programs and mental health evaluations with the expectation of reunification once a healthy environment can be established.

## **Therapeutic Foster Boarding Home**

This program addresses the needs of New York City's "hardest to place" children, ages 7 to 17. We provide specialized services to children who have suffered repeated disrupted placements, psychiatric hospitalizations and placements in residential treatment facilities. Annually, we care for 60 children in therapeutic foster homes where foster parents have received special training to provide the level of care and security these children need.

## **Youth Development**

Our Youth Development Program is for all teenagers, ages 14 to 20, in our foster care programs. It is designed to prepare our youth for the transition from foster care to self-sufficiency. Cardinal McCloskey Services (CMS) uses educational workshops, tutoring and weekend retreats to empower our youth to be confident and self-sufficient and offer vital support and encouragement as they approach adulthood. Whether our youths would like to explore career opportunities, pursue vocational training or higher education, our exceptionally dedicated staff collaborates with each youth to identify each individual's unique passions and talents and guide them through the necessary steps to achieve their goals. CMS provides on-going support for these young adults even after they age out of foster care. The Youth Development program will play an important role in the agency's future, as we believe empowerment and education are the key components to a successful life.

## **Adoption Services**

Our adoption unit is consistently awarded New York City's highest honor of "Outstanding Achievement" in Adoption Services. While our goal is to keep the family unit together, the safety of our children is our top priority. Unfortunately, there are situations where it is impossible for a child to remain with or return to their birth parents. In these very sad situations, our adoption unit social workers are dedicated to finding loving and stable permanent homes for these children. During the past two years, the adoption unit secured homes for nearly 100 children, once again surpassing its goals and making it one of the preferred providers of adoption services in the New York City area.



## **Hayden House Emergency Residence and Cardinal McCloskey School**

Our Hayden House Emergency Residence carries on the legacy of Cardinal McCloskey's original facility for abused or neglected children in Westchester County. Each year Hayden House provides around-the-clock emergency intervention to approximately 60 children in crisis between the ages of 8 and 18. Once at Hayden House, children receive temporary care until suitable and safe living arrangements are made. During this time each child receives a total diagnostic evaluation and a comprehensive care plan so they can begin to put their lives back together. During the past 20 years, more than 2,250 of Westchester's abused children began the road to recovery at Hayden House.

These children come to us directly from courts, hospitals, police stations and other social service agencies arriving both during the day and night, usually with nothing more than the clothes on their backs. Thanks to Margaret "Bunny" Mastronardi and her sisters Carol Mastoloni and Ruth Baldwin, CMS can now provide these children with some essential items. Through a \$15,000 grant awarded to us by The Charles A. Mastronardi Foundation, we have initiated "Bunny's Closet" at Hayden House, which provides each child with a welcome basket containing a brand new comforter, pillow, sheets, pajamas, slippers and toiletries upon arrival at Hayden House. The best part is, the children are allowed to take their basket with them when they are ready to leave.



The Cardinal McCloskey School is licensed by the New York State Department of Education and is recognized as the only school of its kind in Westchester County. It is located at Hayden House and serves grades 4 through 12 with a secular education following the NYS-mandated Regents curriculum. Children are required to take and pass all standardized tests following the NYS Department of Education testing schedule.

As part of the educational programs, we have created ASPIRE (Academic Support, Personalized Intervention and Remedial Education), an after-school program that uses computers to help the children catch up academically. ASPIRE has continued to grow through generous grants of \$10,000 from the MBIA Foundation, \$10,000 from the St. Faith's House Foundation, and \$5,000 from the Hitachi America, Ltd. Foundation. We were blessed to witness our children passing the Regents exams and advancing three reading grade levels in mere months. These achievements demonstrate the remarkable resilience of our children.

Cardinal McCloskey Services' WRAP (Wellness, Recreation And Play) Program was designed as a way for our children to participate in different activities to introduce them to a healthy lifestyle in a fun and recreational way. The program allows CMS to offer children healthy recreational experiences that may be routine in the lives of others, but were new for these children. To help achieve this goal we added an exercise room at Hayden House. A big "thank you" to Entergy Corporation for their generous \$20,000 grant which enabled us to purchase a treadmill, elliptical machine, and much more. The kids are enjoying it.

Our DIRECTIONS Program at Hayden House, made possible through the NY Life Foundation's generous grant of \$20,000, was another successful initiative for CMS. Our Hayden House children face overwhelming challenges as they struggle to recover from their abuse and also navigate the difficult transition from adolescence to adulthood without the support of caring parents, family structure or positive role models. Through DIRECTIONS, teens will receive vitally important character development and life skills education such as career planning, budgeting and money management, as well as compassionate counseling, and practical hands-on life skills experiences attuned to their individual needs. We look forward to growing this program and continuing to help these children.

In order for us to provide our children with excellent care, Hayden House was in need of a few updates. We have completed the addition of three new classrooms, a science lab, new bedrooms, and a lounge area. The community's continued support of Hayden House assures our confidence in the future of this piece of Westchester's history.





### **Tappan Girls' Group Home**

As an alternative to the traditional foster home, our Tappan Girls' Group Home provides teenage girls, ages 12 to 20, some of whom have been physically and sexually abused, with a safe place to live and services to meet their educational, vocational and social needs. Their health care and mental health needs are also provided for through the program. Our unique model is comprised of a married couple who act as house parents and invite these girls to live in their home. The girls thrive in this environment by attending local schools, maintaining part-time jobs and participating in community activities. The program is a huge success with many of the girls attending college.

### **Preventive Services**

Our Preventive Services Program was launched in 1984 as a proactive measure to keep families together through early intervention. We were one of the first agencies in New York City to provide in-depth counseling and case management services to at-risk families. Our goal is to help families find ways of coping with the day-to-day pressures that often result in placing them at-risk. Most of our families consist of single mothers living in poverty, often in substandard housing, with few marketable skills and little support, many of whom have had poor role models. Despite this, these young parents often have an inner resilience, truly love their children and have a desire to provide the best for them. We are happy to say that many of the families we serve are making significant strides and are dedicated to making their lives and the lives of their children better.

Our preventive programs at our Bronx and East Harlem Family Outreach Centers continue to provide families struggling to overcome adversities with resources through our two food pantries and clothing bank. Parenting training, as well as our group, individual and substance abuse counseling, provides families with the resources to break the intergenerational cycle of dysfunction.

Our BEST (Building Emotional Support Together) program which develops specific treatment plans, including individual therapy, group work, early development screening and couples counseling to enhance family relationships, continues to succeed. Our highly experienced staff listened to our clients and implemented great new support groups for women and teens, such as The Women's Empowerment Group. The Group is a positive environment where mothers can learn from other women who have experienced similar life challenges; and is a place where they can express themselves freely.

## **Day Care Programs**

Our Family Day Care Program is the largest provider of subsidized child care in NYC, for children ages 6 weeks to 13 years, on a daily basis. Each year we provide in-home day care services and nutritional food programs for nearly 1,700 children. This valuable program also provides career counseling and job search assistance so that single mothers can successfully enter the workforce and be assured that their children are safe and secure. We operate two child care centers in the Bronx, that are designed to address the cognitive and social development of our pre-school aged children. Every child participating in one of our day care programs is enrolled in the Child and Adult Care Food Program to ensure they receive nutritional meals and snacks.

## **Medical and Clinical Services**

Our Health Services Program provides comprehensive medical care to every child and developmentally disabled adult in our care. The program, designed to address both mental and physical health services, includes routine immunizations, physical examinations, diagnostic and preventive care. Licensed Practical Nurses maintain a steady presence in our group homes and are available on a 24-hour basis. We have Registered Nurses who travel daily to the homes of our clients. Relationships with health care providers and hospitals throughout the community ensure that the highest quality of care is always available.

## **Bridges to Health**

B2H is a state initiative designed to tailor comprehensive care plans for children in foster care with serious emotional disturbances, developmental disabilities, and medical frailties. Studies show that more than half of the children in foster care have one or more mental health disorders (i.e. post-traumatic stress disorder) and at least one chronic medical condition. Our B2H program is designed specifically for these vulnerable children. This revolutionary program offers 14 additional services in these key areas aimed at improving their quality of life until they are 21 years old.





### **Individual Residential Alternative (IRA) Group Homes**

Our Residential Services Program currently operates 14 individual residential alternative (IRA) group homes, for the developmentally disabled, throughout the Bronx, Westchester and Rockland Counties, including homes that serve teens with autism and medically frail adults. Our residents live semi-independently in family-size groups of 4 to 8, under the 24-hour guidance of trained Residence Counselors. Residents are actively involved in the community by attending school, holding jobs, volunteering and attending day programs and vocational training. The comprehensive range of services offered is tailored to enable each unique resident to reach his or her true potential.

### **Service Coordination Program**

Our Service Coordination Program provided services to 85 adults who are developmentally disabled. The program is designed to provide each participant with their own Medicaid Service Coordinator who advocates on behalf of those individuals who cannot do so for themselves. Our Service Coordinators navigate the complex Medicaid system, in an effort to ensure consumers receive the best possible services. During the past two years, the Service Coordination Program expanded to include a Family Support Management Program that provided assistance to 26 families in the community with Medicaid, Social Security, and additional services.

### **Day Habilitation Center**

Our Day Habilitation Center provides programs and services for 17 adults that foster growth in areas such as personal development, social skills, and vocational readiness skills. Our goal is to provide opportunities for them to further develop their social, recreational and basic living skills in a supportive and nurturing environment. Guided by the philosophy that encouragement and empowerment can be transformative, our staff encourages participants to set and achieve personal goals, which they do with amazing success. Several of our participants volunteer in the community at day care centers and local food pantries.



## *new programs*

### **Little Angels Head Start**

In April 2009, Little Angels Head Start joined the Cardinal McCloskey Services Family as one of our subsidiaries. Little Angels Head Start currently has 14 centers with 61 classrooms and services over 1,400 children and families in the Bronx and Manhattan. The goal of the program is to improve the lives of low income children and families by providing exceptional preschool education to 3 and 4 year-olds in half day, full day and extended day sessions. Children receive educational, health and nutrition services in a classroom setting. In addition, the program offers support services to parents to enable them to help their children thrive in school. We look forward to the continued success of this program.

### **Bridges to Health**

The Bridges to Health program continued its success and expanded to serve over 100 children. While we will continue to make our services available to children with complex medical conditions, we are planning to identify additional services that can be utilized to facilitate the growth and development of children with severe disabilities.

### **Strategies for Success**

Through the generosity of our funders, we initiated our Educational Advocacy program, Strategies for Success. With our system in place for documenting and tracking students' progress, we will be better able to meet the educational needs of the children in our foster care program. We plan to use our success to better help and support an even larger number of children in 2010.

### **Drop-In Center**

As a leader in the Bronx community in the areas of providing comprehensive medical and clinical services for at-risk youth and their families, Cardinal McCloskey Services opened a Drop-In Center serving runaway and homeless youth in the Mott Haven section of the Bronx. The Drop-In Center provides a warm and inviting location for youth that promotes their connection with our staff and ultimately serves to facilitate their growth and development.

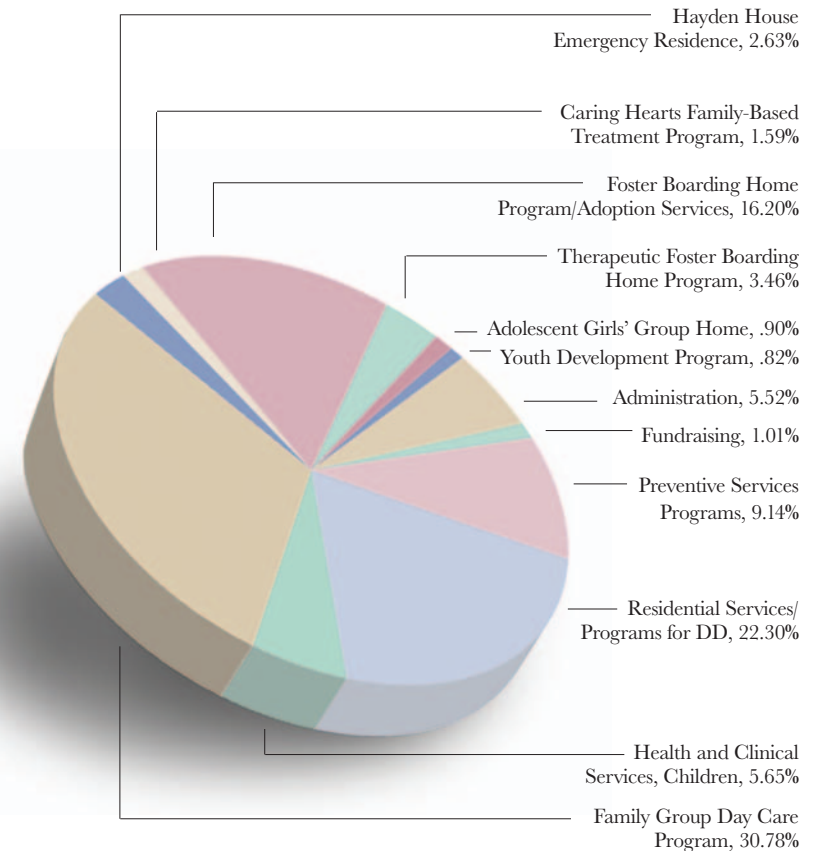
### **Case Management Services**

Our Case Management Services program for the Developmentally Disabled is a referral and advocacy service for our clients in Westchester County. This special program is awarded to us through the local Developmental Service Disability branch of the New York State Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities. It is intended to assist families in Westchester County that are not eligible for Medicaid. We serve 26 families at a time which is the maximum allowed by the State of New York.

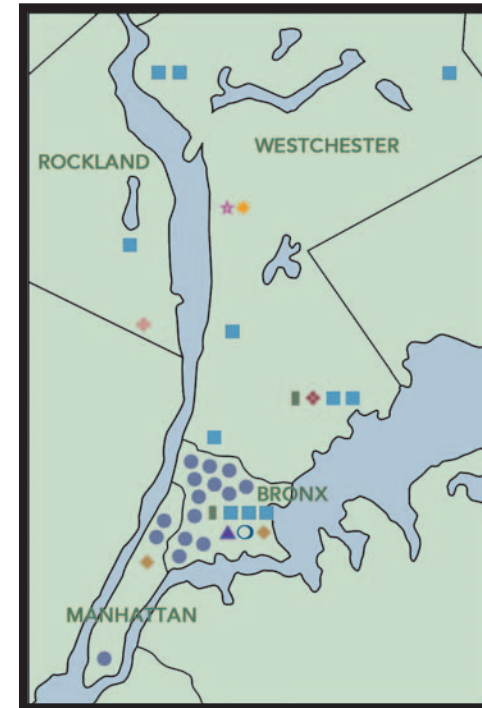
